## 3 Ways You Can Help

Here's how you can help the building fund without using money.
\#1 Bring recyclable metal to Landers Recycling

Monday - Friday 8AM-4PM
Ask scale attendant to put metal on Spring Meadows' account. Metal must be delivered to Landers Recycling do not call Landers for pick-up.
\#2 Bring recyclable metal to church on potluck Sabbath
Metal is picked up from the "roll-up door" in the back of the church each potluck Sabbath.

## \#3 Pick-up and deliver large recyclable metal items for other members

## What Counts as Recyclable Metal

Basic rule: the more metal and less other material the more money.



- Aluminum Cans - beverage cans (best if not crushed)
- Large home appliances washer, dryer, refrigerator, dishwasher, AC unit
- Cars
- Metal autoparts
- Copper - tubing or wiring
- Nuts, bolts, screws, nails, staples, paperclips...

- Small home appliances blender, vacuum, toaster, fans (plastic removed)
- Metal furniture
- Metal mop/broom handles (plastic removed)
- Lead-Acid batteries
- Christmas lights
- Computers
- Brass


## What if I don't have any metal?

How to find metal when you don't have much in your own house:

- Patrol your neighborhood on trash day to pick-up recyclable metal from trash
- Pick up screws and nails while walking (Helps to prevent flat tires too!)
- Ask your friends and neighbors if they can save metal for you to recycle
- And of course, save any aluminum cans from your kitchen
God multiplies everyone's contributions big or little.


## Family Learning Activity

Enjoy disassembling items like vacuums to rescue metal pieces (especially electric motors).

## For Best Results

Make your efforts go farther with these tips.

- Do not crush aluminum cans
- Put aluminum cans in tied bag
- Remove as much plastic as possible. Safely disassemble items, or smash items to remove plastic. (The church gets more money when there is less plastic)
- Of course, thou shalt not steal metal to donate
- Safety first!


## Do Not Bring

Bringing the wrong stuff slows things down.

- Trash
- Glass
- Paper
- Plastic
- Other non-metal recyclables
- Containers with liquids, for example gas cans or paint cans
- Anything that might be radioactive
